

Lent is a time for heart surgery. Every year we are given this opportunity to allow God access to our hearts.

"Let your hearts be broken, not your garments torn."

A broken heart is never a pleasant experience, but it does focus life. In the devastating experience of brokenness, we realise - perhaps for the first time - the true extent of how we felt all along. Paradoxically, we are now confronted with their absence.

Lent is given to teach us how to avoid a broken heart when it comes to God. When our earthly time is over, God will want to greet us without any doubt in His mind as to where our hearts have truly laid all these years. He will grieve with us if we have left it too late to show what we feel.

Allowing God to work on our hearts needs time. No relationship will survive without time. So, let's make time over the next six weeks to go into our room with the Lord in prayer, most especially in listening!
