This weekend marks the close out of *Closer to Christ* in Sacred Heart. As you will be aware, since December our church has been taking part in this Diocesan-wide initiative. The initiative has two main priorities: 1) Supporting our clergy, from formation through to retirement and 2) ensuring our parish has the necessary funding for the future.

The response from this community has been incredible as almost £40,000 has now been pledged by 18 families — I am so grateful to all those who have dropped back their forms so far. As a parish, we originally set out to raise £50,000 in pledges, we are more than 80% of the way there. Fourth Sunday of Easter - Year B - 2024 - Hook

Running after People. Last week after Mass my Mum gave me a small neatly wrapped bag. Inside it contained a packet of mini chocolate Easter Eggs and deodorant, a curious combination. J I have heard it said that you never stop being a parent. The instinct to run after your children, perhaps, never ebbs?

A family, Mum, Dad and four children turned up for the 'quiet' evening Mass. At least one of the children had learning difficulties, which meant on this occasion the Mass was not particularly quiet. There was some 'tutting' from one or two 'regulars' at the back of the Church. As Holy Communion was being distributed, I noticed the family packing up to leave. One of the parishioners noticed their departure and literally **ran after them**. He caught up with them in the car park as they were approaching the exit. Six months later Mum and all four children were baptised, and Dad was Confirmed. At her Baptism Mum shared her story, how God had moved them, how God had run after them.

The mission of the Church, the reason we exist, has always been to run after people. In this long excerpt from the Lord's homily, Jesus points us in the direction of the sheep who are not yet of this sheep pen. They must be brought in also. If a 'church' stops running after people, stops loving and serving neighbours, it has stopped being a Church. As Pope Francis once said, they become museums, then mausoleums. There are numerous signs in this community of that inspires and encourages me to keep on running after people; Colette's ministry to Megan and her family; the Pre-School possibilities, the Caritas ministry to families; all examples of a genuine Church in action.

The Lord also speaks today of 'good' shepherds. From the very beginning Jesus recognised the necessity of Shepherds who would sacrificially love and serve God and His people. A very wise and exemplary priest, Canon Mike Hore, once told me, "All you need to do as a priest is to love God, and to love God's people." This is how we recognise genuine shepherds, leaders in the Church. People are run after, gathered, brought in. Conversely, when we see a lack of care, an absence of love, the sheep scatter and flee. We recognise a hired hand, one who is not a genuine shepherd, may even be a wolf in disguise. We pray today for an authentic Church, for ourselves, that we may never stop running after people. We also pray for the inspired, genuine, sacrificial shepherds among us, that they be recognised and freed up to serve the mission that is ours, to love God and to love God's People.

John 10:11-18

¹¹ "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹² The hired hand is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep. So, when he sees the wolf coming, he abandons the sheep and runs away. Then the wolf attacks the flock and scatters it. ¹³ The man runs away because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. ¹⁴ I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me— ¹⁵ just as the Father knows me and I know the Father—and I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶ I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd. ¹⁷ The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life—only to take it up again. ¹⁸ No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down and authority to take it up again. This command I received from my Father."
