

POPE FRANCIS APRIL PRAYER INTENTION



MARY'S MONTH

On Wednesday, we began the month of May, which traditionally among Catholics is known as "Mary's Month," a specific month of the year when special devotions are performed in honour of the Blessed Virgin Mary. There are many different factors that have contributed to this association. In ancient Greece and Rome, the month of May was dedicated to pagan goddesses connected to fertility and springtime. This, combined with other European rituals commemorating the new season of Spring, led many Western cultures to view May as a month of life and motherhood. In some parts of the early Church, there was a major feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrated on the 15th May, but it was not until the eighteenth century that the month of May received a particular association with the Virgin Mary. According to the *Catholic Encyclopaedia*, "The May devotion in its present form originated at Rome where Fr. Latomia of the Roman College of the Society of Jesus, to counteract infidelity and immorality among the students, made a vow at the end of the eighteenth century to devote the month of May to Mary. From Rome the practice spread to the other Jesuit colleges and thence to nearly every Catholic church of the Latin rite." Various private devotions to Mary quickly became widespread during the month of May. In 1945, Pope Pius XII solidified May as a Marian month when he established the feast of the Queenship of Mary on 31st May. After Vatican II, this feast was moved to 22nd August, but 31st May became instead the feast of the Visitation of Mary.

This May, then, let us frequently call on the help of Mary's prayers, especially by attending Mass and by reciting the Rosary.

SACRED HEART PRE-SCHOOL PROPOSAL

Dear Brothers and Sisters, we have just received some news from the Diocese regarding the proposal to revitalise the use of the Presbytery as a Pre-School. As you know, this is a mission led concept that would bring children and families into contact with the Sacred Heart family. This medium to longer term arrangement would additionally generate income for the church and save an otherwise dilapidating property.

When I first learned of this possibility before Christmas, I immediately sought advice from the Diocese as to how best to explore options. The Vicar General, Canon Hopgood, helpfully and promptly sought advice from the Bishop. Bishop Philip indicated an openness to the idea, but the proposal would need to be supported and promoted by the wider Basingstoke Parish/Pastoral Area ('PA') as part of their 'Ten Year Plan'. Concurrently, we contacted the Diocesan Estates Department to put them on notice that the project was being discussed and the consultation period began.

Sarah Brown and her colleagues presented the proposal formally to us at Sacred Heart before Easter. It was comprehensively discussed and broadly supported by Sacred Heart parishioners. The project was then presented to Fr John Lee, representing the PA, who swiftly added his support. The Diocesan Estates Department acknowledged receipt of the Proposal but claimed they were unaware of the discussion. Moreover, they suggested contact should have been made with them at the very start. Nonetheless, recognising the evident injustice to all concerned, Estates made every effort to expedite matters. Estates then suggested they should contact the Bishop, and the other Vicar General who oversees the Curia (Diocesan Admin), to obtain their view at to the use of the Presbytery. On the 29th April this response was received,

'The bishop thinks that it would be better to let the presbytery as a "temporary let" and is therefore not in favour of the proposed change in use of the presbytery.'

It transpires that the Bishop and Canon McAuley VG made this decision without any knowledge or information about the Pre-School Proposal, its mission-led focus, or that it was an element of the local Pastoral Area Plan. They were simply informed a 'nursery' wanted to take it over.

On behalf of the Diocese, I express my profound regret at what has occurred these past months. My apologies extend to Sarah and her Team who have spent time, effort and financial resources to explore the possibility. I also extend my apologies to you, the Sacred Heart family, who had taken the time to explore this Proposal, to pray about it, and to thrash out the pros and cons together. That, in itself, speaks to me of who we are as a family of faith. This was never a done deal, but the Proposal was certainly worthy of due process and careful consideration. It seems neither have been present in this instance.
