MARY'S MONTH

The month of May, which traditionally among Catholics is known as "Mary's Month," a specific month of the year when special devotions are performed in honour of the Blessed Virgin Mary. There are many different factors that have contributed to this association. In ancient Greece and Rome, the month of May was dedicated to pagan goddesses connected to fertility and springtime. This, combined with other European rituals commemorating the new season of Spring, led many Western cultures to view May as a month of life and motherhood. In some parts of the early Church, there was a major feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrated on the 15th May, but it was not until the eighteenth century that the month of May received a particular association with the Virgin Mary. According to the *Catholic Encyclopaedia*, "The May devotion in its present form originated at Rome where Fr. Latomia of the Roman College of the Society of Jesus, to counteract infidelity and immorality among the students, made a vow at the end of the eighteenth century to devote the month of May to Mary. From Rome the practice spread to the other Jesuit colleges and thence to nearly every Catholic church of the Latin rite." Various private devotions to Mary quickly became widespread during the month of May. In 1945, Pope Pius XII solidified May as a Marian month when he established the feast of the Queenship of Mary on 31st May. After Vatican II, this feast was moved to 22nd August, but 31st May became instead the feast of the Visitation of Mary.

This May, then, let us frequently call on the help of Mary's prayers, especially by attending Mass and by reciting the Rosary.

The Father's Business. In 1999 I began a long preparation period to join the Royal Air Force as a Chaplain. At the end of the process, I was required to attend RAF Cranwell to undertake the Officer Selection Board along with Doctors, Dentists, Lawyers also seeking to join up. One of the exercises took place in the gym. We were required to cross from one side to the other over a series of obstacles without touching the floor. We were to achieve this as a team, which meant we literally had to hang onto each other. Part way across, one of my female colleagues lost her balance and grabbed me. I was very happy to oblige of course, but in the moment I exclaimed, "Anytime!" instantly I saw the Sergeant, who was assessing our every move, scrawl a red line through my name marking the end of a promising career in the Air Force and, no doubt, a major contribution to the nations' security!

In retrospect, I think the Sergeant may have had a point. Unwittingly I wasn't taking the exercise seriously enough. Momentarily I had forgotten that I was part of a team preferring instead to express my individuality, which potentially interrupted the job we all had to achieve. Jesus reminds us today that following Him means we become part of a team. The Church is a team.

"Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command..... I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you."

Notice how the Lord always speaks of the plural, 'friends', 'servants', 'you'. Previously, faith was understood as an inward looking 'me and God' concern, often rooted in fear. Now, faithfulness is to be found in family, the Family of Faith, rooted in love always facing outwards. The Commandments, the Law, rooted in love, honoured through the person, Jesus, rather than a rule book.

The Lord highlights two characteristics in an authentic Church family that should be plainly visible for all to see. First, we sacrifice. We readily forego personal gain or advantage in the cause of loving and serving others. Second, we remain; not a reference to Brexit! Rather, we are invited to remain in right and clear communication with God. We do this by following the Commands Jesus gave, to love God, neighbour and self at all costs.

I heard it suggested this week that a faithful Catholic is one who 'works towards his or her own salvation'. This was the pre-Christian approach. No, our job is to work always towards the salvation of others, our spouses, our family, our neighbours. Jesus already has your back and mine, **AS** we have the backs of others. This is the deal. This is **the Fathers' Business**.

John 15:9-17

⁹ "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love. ¹¹ I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. ¹² My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. ¹³ Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command. ¹⁵ I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶ You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you. ¹⁷ This is my command: Love each other.
