#### **MARY'S MONTH**

The month of May, which traditionally among Catholics is known as "Mary's Month," a specific month of the year when special devotions are performed in honour of the Blessed Virgin Mary. There are many different factors that have contributed to this association. In ancient Greece and Rome, the month of May was dedicated to pagan goddesses connected to fertility and springtime. This, combined with other European rituals commemorating the new season of Spring, led many Western cultures to view May as a month of life and motherhood. In some parts of the early Church, there was a major feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrated on the 15th May, but it was not until the eighteenth century that the month of May received a particular association with the Virgin Mary. According to the Catholic Encyclopaedia, "The May devotion in its present form originated at Rome where Fr. Latomia of the Roman College of the Society of Jesus, to counteract infidelity and immorality among the students, made a vow at the end of the eighteenth century to devote the month of May to Mary. From Rome the practice spread to the other Jesuit colleges and thence to nearly every Catholic church of the Latin rite." Various private devotions to Mary quickly became widespread during the month of May. In 1945, Pope Pius XII solidified May as a Marian month when he established the feast of the Queenship of Mary on 31st May. After Vatican II, this feast was moved to 22nd August, but 31st May became instead the feast of the Visitation of Mary.

This May, then, let us frequently call on the help of Mary's prayers, especially by attending Mass and by reciting the Rosary.

#### Seventh Sunday of Easter - Year B - 2024 - Hook

**Set Apart.** A few days ago, I was doing some shopping at Tesco's. As I was surveying the fruit, I heard a kafuffle behind me. At the entrance the security man had stopped a chap who, he suspected, had not paid for his shopping. A tussle ensued and the security man started to be manhandled. I was stunned, as was another man standing close to me. For some reason we remained rooted to the spot. Even though the security man needed our help and support, we remained bystanders. Speaking to the security officer afterwards, he explained this was a common experience for him, that he was 'used to it'. Similarly, he was 'used' to being unattended when requiring assistance. I so regretted not standing by him.

An extraordinary thing for Jesus to say about Himself. In what sense did the Lord need to be sanctified? In our parlance 'sanctification' has become a pious, ethereal, almost unearthly word. Yet Jesus understood sanctification in biblical terms, a much more physical, practical concept. The Bible teaches that one who is sanctified is one who is visibly set apart. God set His Son apart from the world. God sanctified Jesus. He sanctifies us. You and I have been set apart to live lives that are set apart from worldly living; to live as Jesus lived. Thus, Jesus prayed,

"Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth."

"For them I sanctify myself, that they too may be truly sanctified."

Brothers and Sisters, we will be set apart from worldly ways if we allow ourselves to be impacted by God's Truth, God's Word. If we allow God's Word to challenge, move, and change us, we will find ourselves living differently. We will be in the world, but not of it.

Christians are not called to be pious, distant, wacky, or weird people. On the contrary, we are set apart precisely to engage the world and, by God's Grace, to change it. We don't walk away from someone in need. We walk towards them. God give us the courage and the strength through His Word to be distinct, to be different, to stand beside rather than bystand!

#### John 17:11-19

I will remain in the world no longer, but they are still in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name, the name you gave me, so that they may be one as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them and kept them safe by that name you gave me. None has been lost except the one doomed to destruction so that Scripture would be fulfilled. "I am coming to you now, but I say these things while I am still in the world, so that they may have the full measure of my joy within them. I have given them your word and the world has hated them, for they are not of the world any more than I am of the world. My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one. They are not of the world, even as I am not of it. Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world. For them I sanctify myself, that they too may be truly sanctified.
