Week 2 – 1 July 2024 - Food for thought


Week 3 - 8 July 2024 - The life of Prayer

10th Sunday in Ordinary Time – 2024 – Hook

Sometimes you wanna go, Where everybody knows your name. And they're always glad you came

You wanna be where you can see, Our troubles are all the same, You wanna be where everybody knows your name – by Gary Portnoy & Judy Hart

Do you recognise those words? Yes, they come from the American sitcom 'Cheers'. It was half an hour of cheer where you could escape the hum drum and magically join a 'family' where everybody knows your name, they're always glad you came, you realise our troubles are all the same, where everybody knows your name.

Jesus had a family, but they thought he had lost his mind because

'he looked at those seated in a circle around him and said, "Here are my mother and my brothers!"

The Way of Jesus is to recognise every person as a brother or sister, another place where God's Spirit lives. So, what we did at the end of Mass – reaching out to someone we don't know - was no gimmick. It is something we do, something we should be doing without prompt, to be faithful to the Master because they are our sister or brother.

Which brings us neatly, if not disturbingly, to the contrary.

"...people can be forgiven all their sins and every slander they utter, but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never be forgiven; they are guilty of an eternal sin."

Jesus is reminding us that our sins, in all their shapes and sizes, can be, have already been, forgiven on the cross. At the same time, if I willfully and persistently refuse to recognise the presence and work of the Holy Spirit, I will not be forgiven this sin. I will be choosing to drown in unforgiveness.

I can commit this sin by refusing to recognise my neighbour as my brother or sister as a matter of principle. It is all too easy to point fingers at examples where brothers and sisters have not been recognised by others, including the Church, through exclusion, judgement etc. But it begins with you and me. Taking the time to say thank you, for example. To all who gave their lives on the beaches of Normandy, absolutely! But also, to the woman on the till in Sainsburys, because she is your sister. Choose to be a person of persistent, wilful, love and generosity this week, a sure sign you already live in THE Kingdom where everybody knows your name.
