# Suggestion Update 2 - 21.07.24

Welcome to the regular update slot in the newsletter/website regarding all the suggestions you have made, which aim to prosper and grow what we are doing under God's Grace at Sacred Heart. THANK YOU for the effort and energy you have contributed thus far. This now has to be matched by participation to ensure our life and mission into the future.

The candle money boxes (x2) and the booklets box at the back of the church should be counted once a month by an independent finance person. The church community to know the finance situation

One of the Finance committee members, with another adult, to go through the candle boxes, count the money and leave it for banking, with Jan at the end of each month. Our first date will be 28th July.

There is concern that Parish may be next to close. Get the site valued, start saving fund to buy from Diocese as and when needed. It's up to us. Security of parish future to ensure local ministry rather than Basingstoke.

There has been no indication that the Sacred Heart Church is to close. We continue to be a growing vibrant parish served by an active and engaging priest. The ten-year plan has always been about the number of priests that will be available. This will not change if we tried to buy the site from the Diocese.

Who is Chair of the finance group, and should we have Accounts formally published on an annual basis? Also, who is on the finance group?

The accounts are published every year in September/October. Last year they were in the newsletter for a couple of weeks and any questions were answered in the newsletter. The next set of accounts will be published in September/October 2024

Maggie Wood is the Chairperson and Felix Fernando and Mike Coleman are on the committee. Helping Father John with all financial matters.

Do we have access to CCTV around the Church and who is able to access these cameras? Do they work?

Yes, the cameras work, Jan in the office has access to them.

We need a group to take charge of the hall and ensure that there are enough cleaning products, coffee/tea etc. and supplies are purchased, with receipts given to Jan for reimbursement

Currently there are 3 or 4 parishioners who check on the hall and if any cleaning is required or the dishwasher needs sorting, they carry this out. Supplies are purchased and monies are reimbursed.

The Holy Spirit changes us and conforms us to Christ so that we can move in His authority and power.

On July 27th there is an opportunity to participate in a free mini-retreat morning "HOLY, HOLY; going deeper in Praise, Worship and Prayer" that will explore this in more depth. This meeting on Zoom is hosted by "ADORE" one of the longest-running charismatic days of renewal in the country. The session includes Mass, Adoration, Praise and Worship, inspired Teaching and Prayer for all participants to foster the presence of the Holy Spirit in them. It is part of the 2024 ADORE programme developing our understanding and appreciation of how we are to respond to God's call to holiness; co-operating with the Holy Spirit as He helps us to love and obey God's will to love Him and to love our neighbour.

The dynamic Catholic evangelist and conference speaker Ros Powell will give the main talk, explaining how we can be more open to the grace and presence of the Lord in our lives; being transformed into Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit. We hope you can let your parishioners know about this opportunity for spiritual renewal and formation and encourage their participation in our monthly zoom meetings.

# 15<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Have you ever missed a plane? I have a vivid recollection of the time when I was waiting in the South Terminal of Gatwick Airport for a flight to Ireland. I had checked in with plenty of time to spare, so I decided to attend WH Smiths to buy some newspapers. I was engrossed in my reading when the Tannoy went. "Would Mr Chadwick, a passenger for Dublin, please be kind enough to report to Gate 28 where the aircraft is waiting for him!" I sprinted to the Gate, barely able to breathe, and boarded the plane. Everyone was already seated, buckled up, and 'tutting'. I had lost sight of the present.

Today we hear Jesus giving the Apostles two strict instructions as to how the ministry of proclaiming the Good News should be undertaken. First, no lone rangers. Christian Ministry is about teamwork. When we serve, we are to image a family, the family of God. That is how the Church will be perceived, if it is authentic Church.

Second, the Lord instructs the Apostles, therefore us, to keep our eyes on the present, rather than the future. You need sandals now as you are walking, but you don't need an extra shirt, bread, money, now, this minute. Of course, we need food, clothing, money to survive, but we must be able to prioritise, clearly, decisively. How easy it is to be blinded to the present by plans for the future. How much of our lives is vested in what might be, instead of what is? Rainy day provisions have their place, but only if the **present** has the priority.

Maybe the Lord is asking us to conduct a bit of a review as individuals, as families, and as a family of faith. What do I actually need, now? What do WE actually need, now, to do the Lord's work? Recent events at Sacred Heart, the suggestions, naming the priorities, reaching out to families, young people, the housebound, other churches; all of these represent the priority of the present. This is the Divine mindset. God only lives in the present. So must we, if we are to follow in the footsteps of the first Apostles and to be faithful servants of His.

#### Mark 6:7-13

<sup>7</sup> Calling the Twelve to him, he began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over impure spirits.

<sup>8</sup> These were his instructions: "Take nothing for the journey except a staff—no bread, no bag, no money in your belts. <sup>9</sup> Wear sandals but not an extra shirt. 10 Whenever you enter a house, stay there until you leave that town. 11 And if any place will not welcome you or listen to you, leave that place and shake the dust off your feet as a testimony against them."

<sup>12</sup> They went out and preached that people should repent. <sup>13</sup> They drove out many demons and anointed many sick people with oil and healed them.
