Detachment and Servanthood. Medjugorje is a Croatian village in Bosnia-Herzegovina, where Our Lady is said to have been appearing since 1981. There is a record of a visionary receiving a message from Mary about holiness. Mary is supposed to have identified Pasha, a Muslim woman, as the holiest person in the village. The visionary responded, "But Pasha is a Muslim." Mary acknowledged this fact. Not much is known of Pasha, but we can be certain she knew how to love as she certainly knew how to forgive, given the grave offences committed by some from within the Christian communities during the Balkan conflict. She continued to live in this overwhelmingly Christian village. Somehow, Pasha appeared detached from the hatred and unforgiveness you'd expect, to live and forgive like Jesus. Mary recognised her!

Today Jesus continues the theme of detachment from last week, how we must be detached from everything, in order to be attached to the Way of love. This week, we are warned about another perilous attachment, that of status and power.

Whilst this predicament infects most human beings, Jesus had a particular concern about this happening in the Church. He was so insistent that He said to the Disciples,

"Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant..."

The Lord said, **this is not so among you!** Jesus insists, and continues to insist, this does not happen in the Church! Why? Very simple. When Christians 'lord it' about the place they stop serving. When they stop serving, they cease to reveal Jesus, the purpose of the Church. The risen Lord Jesus created the Church precisely to reveal His face in our day and age through our detached service, through our hearts and our hands.

Lessons to take away. First, am I attached to status or power? Do I 'lord it', or do I sacrifice myself in the service of others? Second, do we see evidence of 'lording' in the Church? If we do, we must call it out. There is only one Lord! The Church must be free of such attachments if we are to faithfully live, to love and forgive that is the Way of Jesus.
