
ADVENT WREATH HYMN

How Priests are Paid

Dear Brothers and Sisters, I am grateful to two parishioners for raising this question. For some reason the Catholic Church does seem to struggle with transparency, especially when it comes to finance. For many the elephant in the room has been how priests, themselves are funded. So, I thought it would be good to share the below with you.

Priests serving in parishes within Portsmouth Diocese will usually receive:

- Rent-free Accommodation In addition they will have utilities, Council Tax, Internet, TV and other building related costs paid for them. This package is considered a 'Benefit in Kind' by HMRC, and therefore taxable as such.
- My own situation is unusual as the Diocese decided a couple of years ago not to offer me a presbytery/flat, or contribute to any related expenses such as rent etc. Thus, I live independently from the church. Thanks to your generosity at Sacred Heart, Hook, the PC/Finance Teams decided to fund my Utilities/Council tax/Building Insurance/Internet in addition to the stipend etc. I am very grateful to you for that.
- Stipend this is ecclesiastical speak for a salary. At present this is set at £863.83 per month.
- 'Stole Fees' this is ecclesiastical speak for the donations people often make to the priest who celebrates their baptisms, weddings and funerals. The word 'fee' is misleading as there are no charges or shouldn't be!! for the sacraments. This is sometimes forgotten by some parishes/priests.
- Funerals are not, strictly speaking Sacraments, but no less vital to our life and ministry as we all know. Funeral Directors habitually charge 'fees' on behalf of the minister/celebrant to the families as part of their overall invoice. The figure is set by the Church of England. A typical ministers 'fee' would be in the region of £250. I have waived this sum in the past when I know there is a particular financial concern for a family. Conventionally, there are no 'fees' taken for a child's funeral, or when a loved one is believed to have taken their own life.
- Mass Offerings/Stipends priests usually claim one offering per Mass they celebrate as part of their income. As you know, I prefer to consider these donations as 'Holy Money' and are therefore given to charity.
- Christmas and Easter Collections are traditionally given to the priest/s in a parish. In common with the rest of his/ their income, it will be taxable by HMRC in the normal way.
- Expenses Priests are re-imbursed for expenses incurred as part of their ministry, such as car mileage @ .45 per mile. The car itself, and related maintenance expenses, are his own responsibility. Vehicles are NOT provided by the church.
- Food/household expenses are the responsibility of the priest.

The quest for truth. Have you ever lost your bearings? You didn't quite know where you were? I recall being on the Picadilly Line in London. I was on my way to Heathrow to do some work in the Chaplaincy there. For a few moments I just didn't know where I was. Momentarily I lost the ability to read the wording on the map due to a head injury I had sustained following a road accident. It was very disconcerting, but when I started to regain comprehension, the relief was amazing. I was no longer lost. The truth was again revealed in delightful Hounslow!

"Everyone on the side of truth listens to me."

Today the Lord reminds us that He is the source of all truth. A decision to follow Him means we take sides. We take the side that is truth against the side that is falsehood. Those who belong to the side of truth will naturally take great heed of what the Author of all truth has to say. What Jesus says will be taken to heart, to our minds, as well as our bodies. People will notice it. They will be able to plainly see whose side we are on.

Does this mean that those who take the side of truth have a trouble-free existence. Sadly not. It's often the contrary. Sometimes it's a harder path to side with the truth. It can even seem unintelligible at times; a bit like me on the Piccadilly Line. Yet, by God's Grace, in faith, we hang in there. We trust the Lord will reveal the lettering again – God always does - as we continue our journey towards our heavenly home.

So, Brothers and Sisters, which side are you on? If you belong to the side of truth, expect tough times. But in those times, at all times, **keep listening to the Boss** who is The Way, the Truth, and the Life.
