

Third Sunday in Lent - Year C - 2025 - Hook

Wood for the Trees. Years ago, I attended Slough Magistrates Court with a client who had attracted the notice of the media. The public gallery was packed. Other lawyers piled in to see what I would say on behalf of defendant, who was facing numerous allegations of a vile nature. His instructions were that I should apply for bail before the matter was dealt with in the Crown Court. It was a hopeless case, but instructions are instructions. I opened by encouraging the Magistrates to "see the wood for the trees". Now, the sole purpose of this hearing was to determine whether Mr X should be released on bail, not to make decisions about his guilt or innocence. The Bench retired for almost an hour for the Chair to calmly announce bail should be given. The Prosecutor, who had done no work believing a remand into custody was in the bag, scorned me. As I left everyone looked at me with disgust, "you should be ashamed of yourself!"

Understandably, people get streamed up about certain issues. People 'love' to lay the law down, to judge, to scape-goat even. It has been ever thus. Two thousand years ago people readily believed in the 'sins of the fathers' idea, that calamity befell those who had badly sinned, or their relatives had. Both the massacre in the Temple and the 18 who were crushed under the tower in Siloam, were cited to Jesus as examples of precisely that. They must have done something terrible for that to happen! What did the Lord say?

"...do you think they were more guilty than all the others living in Jerusalem? I tell you, no! **But unless you re**pent, you too will all perish."

Jesus entirely dismissed this thinking as <u>FALSE</u>. Our minds must refocus, He exhorted, on what is true. We are not to look at others, their sins, however heinous. Instead, we must look at ourselves. We presume, unwisely, that we will have all the time in the world to get our ducks in a row, to get our hearts on track, to rediscover the honest, humble way that is the Way of Jesus, the way of repentance. Or we can choose to perish.

Repentance means I listen to the Lord's voice, massively, as if my life depended on it. It does! Repentance means I develop an instinct to look out for others before I look out for myself. Or I can choose to perish. Repentance means when I perceive a need in others, I have received a call to respond with outrageous generosity, **to see the wood for the trees.**
